David Wynde -- Portland Public Schools Budget and the Arts Tax Deputy CFO and Budget Director, PPS

These minutes do not reflect David Wynde's exact words but reflect the spirit of the conversation (and as much as I could type, trying to keep up with the conversation).

David: Legally no, practically yes. Two places with number restrictions. In Kindergarten, we try to ensure no more than 25 in each classroom. If there are not enough classrooms, add more adults. In high schools, teachers can have no more than 180 on their teaching load during the course of the day.

Parent Question: Will there be full day kindergarten in the future we don't have to pay for?

David: Yes, I believe we will in the future.

Parent Question: How can we impact the core funding issues?

David: Given the Governor and Mayor's commitment to education, what do you see in the near future for PPS budget?

Governor Kitzhaber has said:

- 1) continuum -- early childhood, K-12, college
- 2) we are not funding adequately
- 3) have to change funding streams but first need to bring healthcare and PERs under control

City also has budget shortfall. Mayor has some influence.

Parent Question: Are there any nationwide models that we could use for classrooms sizes, funding? Funding is stable in Washington -- what is the difference between there and here?

David: Washington has different funding streams. In Oregon, we have a totally revenue based funding stream. We are more dependent on a single funding stream: the income tax. Because of the kicker law -- we blow the upside. But never ask for it back when there is a shortfall.

Parent Question: As parents, what can we do?

David: You can communicate with your state legislature. The single most important thing is to insure they fund K - 12 at least \$6.75 billion this biennium. Call, keep it short and sweet, they are counting. In your own words. Doesn't have to be once.

David: What is the path to hope? How does this change? There is a three step path to a very different budget. But first you have to understand the local option levy -- the local property tax -- and the impact of compression the amount we collect. Measure 5 limits taxes for education for \$5 per \$1000 of real market value. Measure 50 changes assessed value and reset it to 95% and limits increases to no more than 3% per year. If assessed value is more than 65% of the market value, you are not paying all of the taxes you would normally pay. We are losing \$27 million in compression. We are only collecting \$50 million of potentially \$77 million.

Principal's Report

Andrea reported that she and Rieke parent Laura Connell met with photographers this week to explore options for using a different company to take head shots and class pictures. They will invite a few companies to come to a future PTA meeting.

Over spring break, the library will get a new power pole with data ports. This will address the currently limited access to the library card catalog. Additionally, Andrea received permission to get a substitute while Miss Jayne is out. The substitute is a licensed librarian.

There is a new rule for parents dropping off their children in the morning. If you come after 8:45, you will have to drop off your child. You will not be able to go down the hallway with them. Andrea noted that if children arrive 5 minutes late each day, he or she will lose 17 hours over the course of a year.

Also, please do not drop off lunches, library books or other items directly in the child's classroom. If you must drop something off, please do so at the office.

Common Core Standards - Independence and Perseverance

Common Core Standards - Math

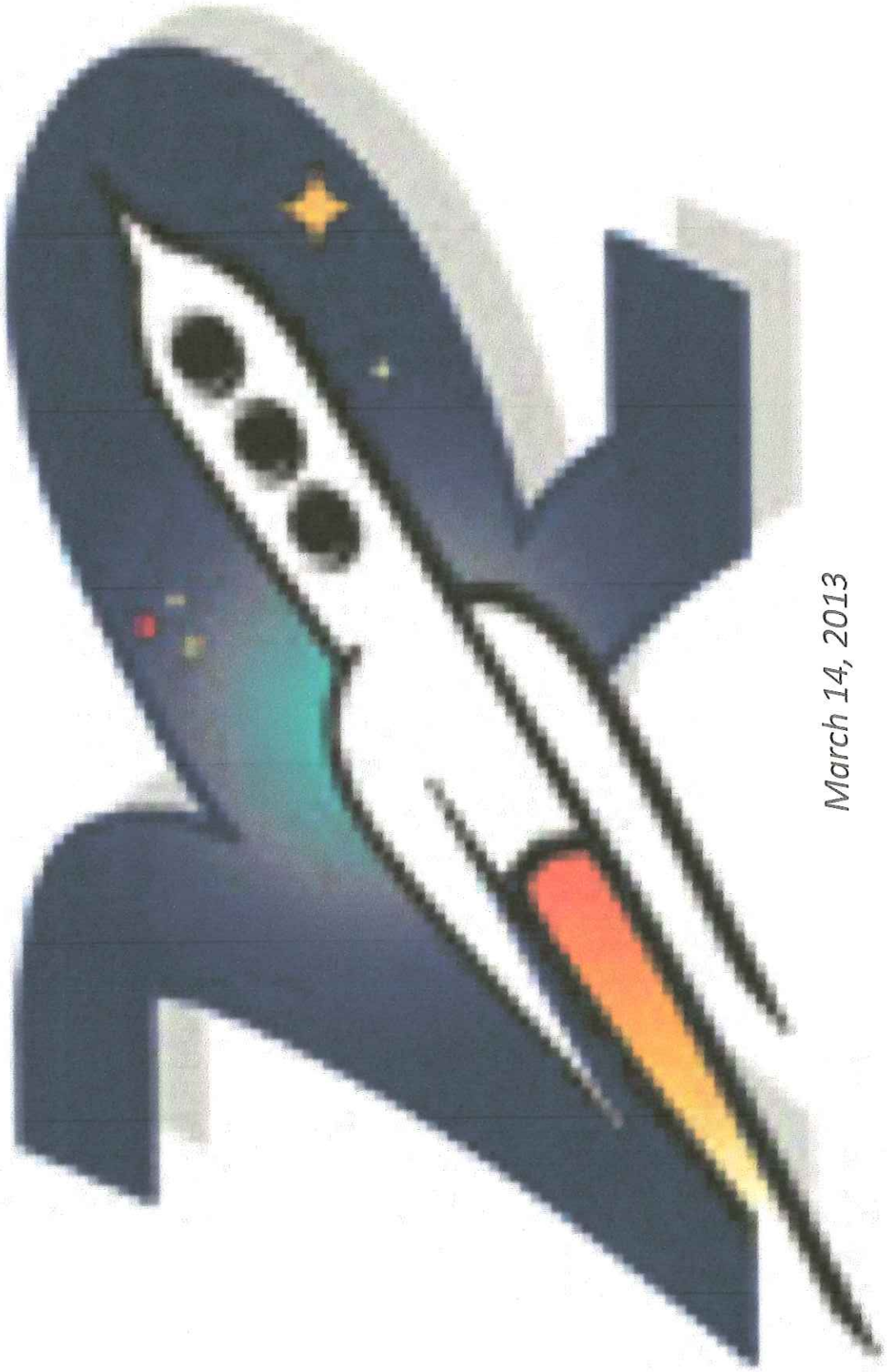
Andrea explained how the adoption of the common core standards affects the way math is taught throughout PPS. There are 5 domains to math. The standards are taught by grade level; divisions by K - 5, 6 - 8 and 9 - 12. Skills are not taught broadly at every grade level. For example, fractions are taught in grades 3 - 5. Fractions are applied in grades 6 - 12 but not taught. Another example: in Kindergarten, kids have to write and recite 1 - 100, with some skipping by 2s, 5s, 10s. 1st grade teachers will not teach this skill.

Many concepts have been compacted down grade levels. 5th grade is now teaching some concepts and skills that were formerly only taught in middle school.
